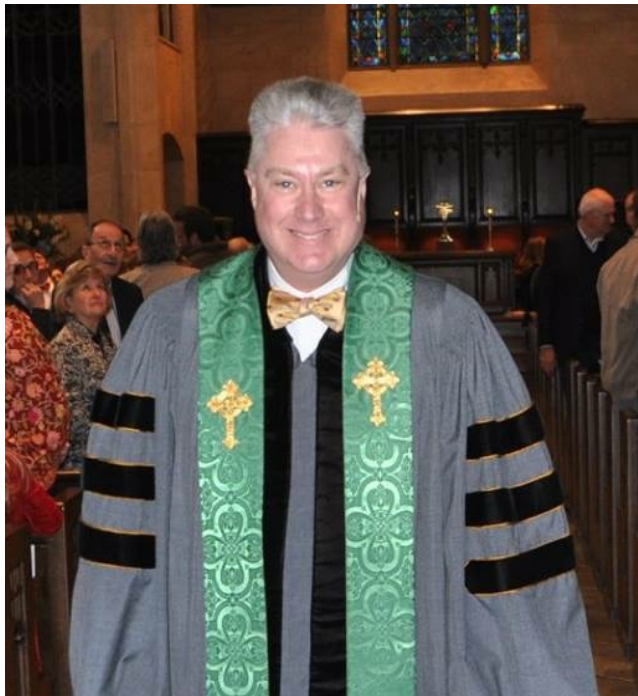


Reverend Dr. Paul Seelman
